Chapter Donation to Fisher House

It's been some time since wounded Sky Soldiers have been hospitalized at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center (WRNMMC). This respite has allowed the Chapter to reorient its charitable giving to Associationaffiliated scholarships and The Fisher House Foundation, at WRNMMC, in Bethesda, MD.

So it was on April 4, 2017, when a contingent of seven Sky Soldiers met with Ms. Jessica Reddish, an assistant to the Bethesda Fisher House Manager. This was the third time Chapter Members have visited and donated money to this worthy charity.

Ms. Reddish took the Band of Brothers through the facility while she explained how the Fisher Houses came to be and what services it provides.

The Fisher House program was established by Zachary Fisher and his wife Elizabeth. The Fisher Houses provide residence for military and veteran family members while the Service Member/Veteran is being treated.

There are 71 Fisher Houses located on 24 military installations and 29 Veteran Affairs medical centers. To date, the program has offered more than six million days of lodging to more than 305,000 service families.

Everyone was impressed with the quality the facility and dedication of the staff to serving the families of those being treated at WRNMMC.

After the tour, Mack Brooks, Garrett Clemons, Bill Connolly, Joe Flesch, Henry Persons, and Jim Yarrison watched as Ed Anthony presented Ms. Reddish with the Chapter's \$500.00 donation. Ms. Reddish accepted the Chapter's gift and the Sky Soldiers left knowing that they have met their obligation to serve. We look forward to the next opportunity to support the Fisher House Foundation.

Chapter Donation to the US Army Heritage and Education Center (AHEC) Foundation

It was unseasonably cool, windy, and yes, rainy, for late April, but the Chapter had approved donating \$500.00 to Army Heritage and Education Center (AHEC) Foundation and the ten-man Chapter contingent was there to honor that commitment.

Chapter participants included Mack Brooks, Joe Flesch, Roy Gilmore, Jack Kranchick, John Kingeter, Henry & Brenda Persons, Bob Read, and Terry & Patrice Walsh.

April 25, 2017, was not the first time the Chapter had donated to AHEC. On September 14, 2015, the Chapter approved donating one of two signed Iwo Jima Monument lithographs and \$550.00 to the AHEC Foundation.

Believe it or not, there is 173^d Airborne Brigade history that connects it to the Marine Corps. The 4th Battalion, 503rd Infantry, 173d Airborne Brigade Separate, was attached to the

Marine Corps 3rd Division and conducted joint operations with them in Da Nang, South Vietnam, in late 1966. The 4th Battalion, 503rd received the Presidential Citation (Navy) for excellent service during the attachment.

The lithograph was signed by Felix de Weldon, the designer and sculptor of the Iwo Jima

monument. The Chapter's donated copy of the Iwo Jima lithograph still hangs at AHEC. Few in the Chapter 1 group had been to the facility before. So, the visit began with the Center staff explaining AHEC's mission. They explained that AHEC, in Carlisle, PA, is affiliated with the Army War College and is supported by the Army Heritage Center Foundation. AHEC is dedicated to telling the Army story - one Soldier at a time. Its facilities and activities include a museum, archives, a library, and educational services for visitors and researchers.

After the orientation, the group proceeded to the newly installed AHEC World War I exhibition, where Chapter President, Joe Flesch, presented the \$500.00 donation to Mike Perry, the Foundation Director, on behalf of Chapter 1. The presentation was followed by a group photo, framed by other artifacts from The Great War.

With the official business over, despite intermittent showers, some elected to take advantage of one of AHEC's most appealing

attractions, the Army Heritage Trail.

The Heritage Trail is USAHEC's outdoor museum. It covers about one mile of replicated structures and artifacts from nearly every era of Army history, including fourteen full scale exhibits from the French and Indian War to the War on Terrorism. It was a memorable experience for all.

I've gotten lots of positive feedback, especially from folks wanting to browse back issues of "The Herd Word."



Drive to An Khe. Visit local area, then drive back to Quy Nhon. Overnight Avani Resort and Spa, Qui Nhon

Wednesday 15 Nov

Visit Cham Towers en route to Tuy Hoa. Overnight Aviani Resort and Spa, Qui Nhon

Thursday, 16 Nov

Drive to Bong Son, then Hoi An. Stop en route to hamlet, specializing in making tapioca powder and rice papers. Arrive Quang Ngai; brief visit to My Lai. Then onto Chu Lai airport and the Americal Division base. Overnight Lantana Hoian Boutique Hotel.
