SKY SOLDIERS REUNION 2016 FORT BENNING and COLUMBUS, GEORGIA

Sky Soldiers had their 2016 Reunion at Ft. Benning and Columbus, Georgia. For many of us this is where it all began. Many of the old Sky Soldiers at this Reunion served in Vietnam and were engaged in combat within months of their training at Ft. Benning; many would never return to Benning or home ever again. So we came, like pilgrims returning to a distant homeland, back to Benning.

Like other reunions, this was a gathering of old friends and comrades. Stories are told and retold that change with time; some things added and probably embellished as time goes by. 
Membership Reminder




